

## IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT YOUR DRINKING WATER

Mountain Water System WV3301963 did not meet scheduled monitoring requirements.

Our water system violated a drinking water reporting requirement the past year. Even though this was not an emergency, as our customers, you have a right to know what happened and what we did to correct this situation.

We are required to monitor your drinking water on a regular basis. Results of regular monitoring are an indicator of whether our drinking water meets health standards. During 1/1/2022 to 12/31/2022, we did monitor for the required parameters, but the data was not delivered to us and in turn it was not sent to the state by the due date.

What should I do?

There is nothing you need to do currently.

The table below lists the monitoring we did not conduct, how often we are supposed to sample and how many samples we are supposed to take, how many samples we took and when the samples should have been taken.

What happened? What is being done?

Nitrate sample collected but Nitrite test was run. SOC and VOC samples were collected in the proper quarters, but the wrong ID number was put on one of the sample sheets and the Chlordane test was not performed by the Laboratory. The TTHM and some of the SOC results were not returned from the laboratory until after the due date.
